HPWS Rawalpindi Annual Report 2022

Executive Summary

Hemophilia Patients Welfare Society (HPWS) Rawalpindi is a philanthropic organization. It provides a range of services to hemophilia patients including treatment, consultation, counseling, guidance, and training for better disease management. HPWS Rawalpindi also conducts outreach activities for education & awareness about hemophilia and raise funds for providing quality healthcare to its patients.

During the year 2022, the number of patients registered with HPWS Rawalpindi reached 1400, with 149 new registrations. It supported the treatment of over 1,400 hemophilia patients which included 19 surgical procedures. In 2022, there were 5,428 patient visits to the Society where the patients were provided with the required treatments including the provision of factors VII, VIII, IX, VWD and FEIBA. Moreover, in collaboration with the World Federation of Hemophilia, HPWS Rawalpindi launched the 1st National Treatment Guidelines for Hemophilia and conducted several outreach sessions. It also issued disability cards to hemophilia patients to support them with college/university admissions and be eligible for special job quotas.

In 2022, the HPWS Rawalpindi implemented four treatment projects (including (i) HCV Treatment; (ii) Low Dose Prophylaxis; (iii) Home Therapy; and (iv) Emicizumab Treatment) and three welfare projects (including (i) Hifazat-e-Najam – Adopt a Child; (ii) Hifazat-e-Jan – Save a Life; and (iii) Hifazat-e-Nisa – Help a Female). Additionally, 5,789 patients received training on factor preparation and factor infusion, and 4,413 patients received counseling support. Moreover, HPWS also supported over 2,000 patients to receive treatment at the Hemophilia Treatment Center at the Pakistan Institute of Medical Sciences (PIMS).

Additionally, HPWS conducted various awareness and outreach activities in partnership with different schools and colleges in Rawalpindi/Islamabad and participated in national and international conferences. The Society also organized several field trips/picnics which were especially designed to integrate capacity building activities for hemophilia patients and their families.

The Society also received generous support from the donors who are enabling us to provide quality healthcare services to our hemophilia patients.

In the year 2023, we remain committed to serving our hemophilia patients and look forward to the continued support of our donors.

MESSAGE FROM PRESIDENT & DIRECTOR HTC

This year has seen us improve care delivery & expand to include medical education at all levels, the patients, care givers, general public, health authorities & the core team. The report also gives a detailed account of the wide-ranging work taken to include our patient's interest as a whole.

We have successfully completed the outreach & awareness tasks assigned for the PACT Program of WFH for the year 2022 including the Launch of 1st draft of National Treatment Guidelines for Hemophilia.

Another major achievement is provision of disability cards to 40 of our patients, which will facilitate their treatment as well as admission in colleges/universities and jobs as per quota for such individuals.

This report not only summarizes our achievements for 2022, it also demonstrates the resolve of our staff to rise & meet every challenge & opportunity to promote the health & wellbeing of our inherited Bleeding Disorders Community.
